Ripponlea Primary School is excited about the upcoming year of teaching and learning. We'd like to share our school's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Please remember that schools provide students with free standard curriculum instruction, and all contributions to our school are voluntary. However, the continued support of our families ensures we can provide the best education and support for our students.

We sincerely thank you for your support, whether it's through fundraising, your generous financial contributions, or volunteering your time. Your contributions have had a significant and positive impact on our school, our students, and the programs we can offer.

At our school, this support has allowed us to:

- Enhance well-being programs, including Positive Behaviour Support, Art and Music therapy, Sexuality, Health, Respectful Relationships, Digital Safety, and the Social Stencil program.
- Offer a wide range of subjects and special curriculum experiences, such as cultural days, artist-in-residence
 programs, school productions, carnivals, excursions, camps, sporting events, and our unique specialist
 program for all year levels.
- Improve digital learning opportunities through iPads, laptops, and tools like Mathletics, My Numeracy Portal, Reading Eggs, and Seesaw for student-family engagement.
- Invest in reading resources for home and classroom, including books for guided reading, book clubs, and the school library.
- Maintain school grounds and facilities with regular maintenance and continuous improvements.
- Purchase sports equipment for each year level and upgrade soccer goal posts and safety padding.

In the coming year, we have planned to:

- Revamp the junior playground and fence-line playscapes.
- Expand therapy services for our students.
- Redevelop the Italian garden to create additional seating and shaded areas.

We have implemented a new book pack purchasing system. We recommend that families purchase book packs directly from our recommended supplier, Maxim Office Group. Classroom consumables will still be procured in bulk for shared use.

Refunds

All refund requests must be made in writing. A request for a refund does not automatically equate to a full refund of monies paid.

• Curriculum Contributions:

Where payment has been received for the curriculum contributions and the student is exiting the school, a pro-rata refund, dependent on the number of terms the student has been enrolled at the school for, may be applicable. If it reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred.

Extra-Curricular items and Activities:

Students withdrawing from camps, excursions and extra-curriculum activities can request a refund. A refund (less any non-refundable deposit) will be payable to the parent/caregiver after the event has occurred, if the withdrawal from the activity is due to unavoidable or unforeseen circumstances i.e., illness. Proof may be required e.g., medical certificate.

Where the school is charged a 'group fee' as opposed to a 'per head fee', a refund cannot be calculated until all associated costs have been met.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
